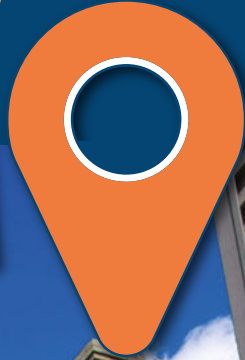

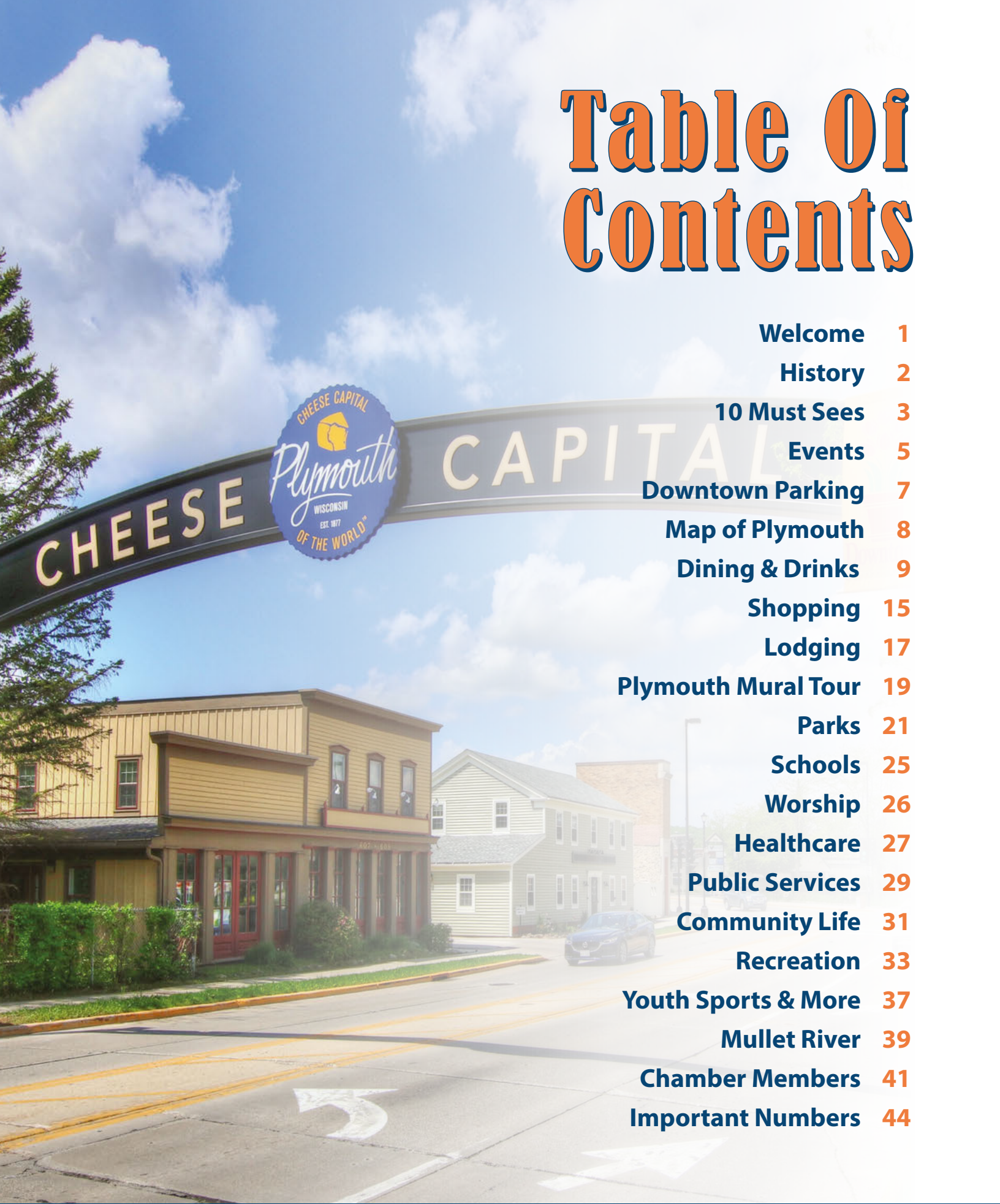

Our History

Plymouth is now a thriving community, but when the first settlers came upon Plymouth, they would have seen not much more than wilderness and a stream surrounded by swampy land. Plymouth was originally known by early Native Americans as "Ta-quit-qui-oc" or Crooked River. Plymouth was originally surveyed in 1835 by United States Engineers with the first land purchase made in 1836.

Plymouth's first settlers, Isaac Thorpe, his two sons John and Rensselaer and his son-in-law, William Bowen, arrived May 8th, 1845. By May 12th they had built a log home. Four days after that night, on May 16th, Mrs. Thorpe and their daughter arrived.

In July 1845, Henry Davidson and his son Thomas arrived. Henry gave the name of Springfield to the new settlement, but Thomas renamed it Plymouth, after Plymouth, Connecticut, where his sweetheart died and lay buried.

In 1847, a surveyor was employed to lay out the western side of Plymouth. A business district was in the works. The first sawmill was built in 1848, and a grist mill was erected in fall 1849. The arrival of the Sheboygan and Mississippi Railroad came in April 1859, and the Milwaukee and Northern Railroad followed in 1871.

Organized in October 1868, a hand engine and 200 feet of rubber hose were purchased. By 1875, a firehouse had been built and the department consisted of three divisions: chemical crew, hook and ladder crew and firefighters.

Plymouth was incorporated as a city in 1877, and Otto Puhlman was elected Mayor. Plymouth was nicknamed "The Hub City," not just because of the central location in the county, but for the manufacturing of hubs and spokes for wagons and bicycles.

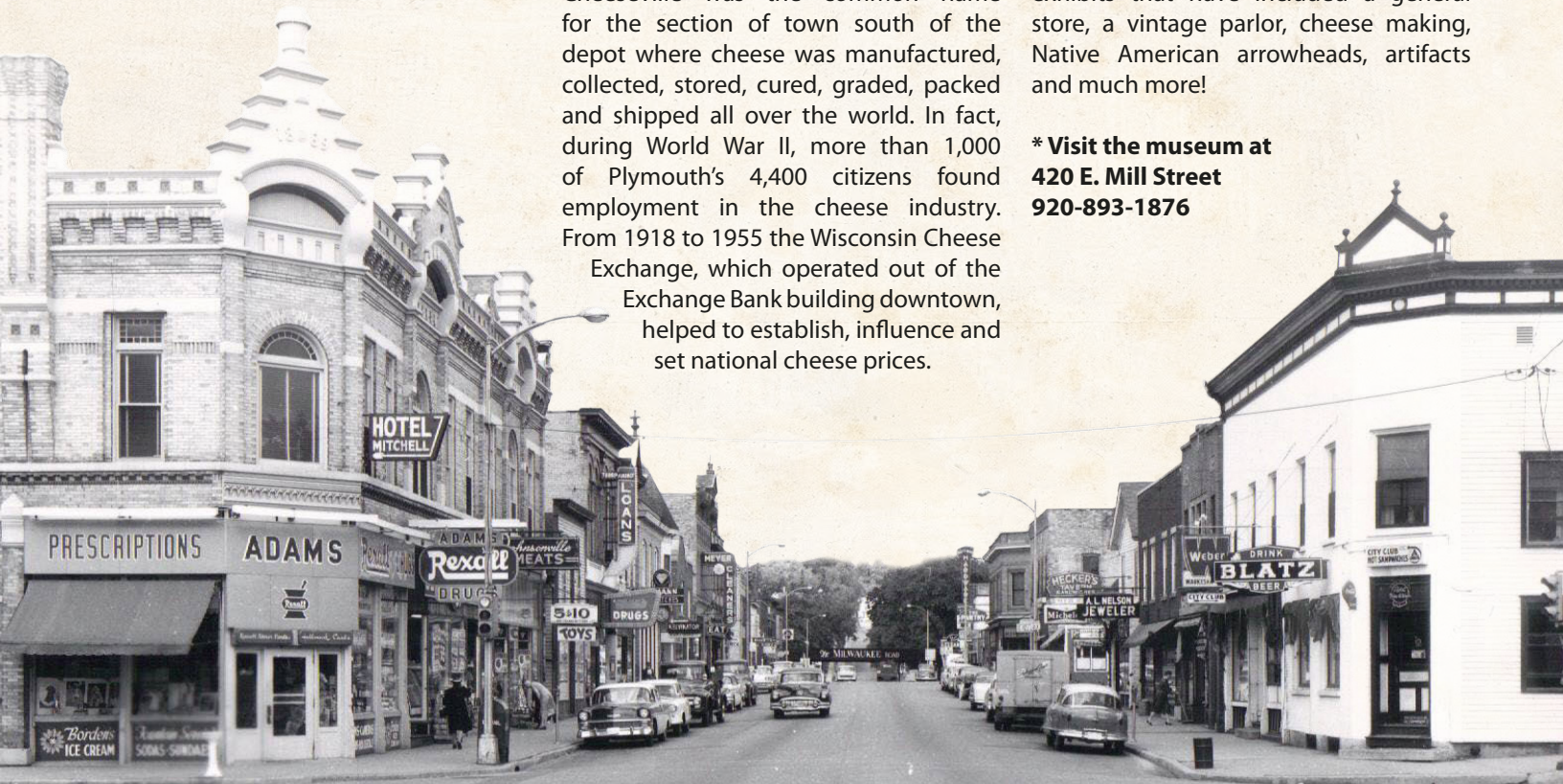
As Plymouth grew, it gained its reputation as the **"Cheese Capital of the World."** Cheeseville was the common name for the section of town south of the depot where cheese was manufactured, collected, stored, cured, graded, packed and shipped all over the world. In fact, during World War II, more than 1,000 of Plymouth's 4,400 citizens found employment in the cheese industry. From 1918 to 1955 the Wisconsin Cheese Exchange, which operated out of the Exchange Bank building downtown, helped to establish, influence and set national cheese prices.

Isaac Thorpe would be proud to see what Plymouth has become. Built by determination, ingenuity and hard work, the values of Plymouth residents remain the same today. Most of the wilderness has been shaped into parks, schools, residential areas and a booming downtown district.

There are 18 buildings that have been landmarked by the city, and a brochure has been made for a self-guided tour of these landmarked buildings. You may pick up a brochure at the Plymouth Chamber of Commerce Office or the Plymouth Historical Society Museum.

The Plymouth Historical Society Museum, located in downtown Plymouth, is housed in a three-story cream city brick commercial building built in 1875. It was originally built as a tavern and residence for Mr. William Sebald and his family. It has been home to the Historical Society since 2007. Open year-round, the free family-friendly museum offers changing exhibits that have included a general store, a vintage parlor, cheese making, Native American arrowheads, artifacts and much more!

1. Murals, Murals, Murals

Downtown Plymouth
Plymouth boasts 30 murals painted throughout the downtown area! 21 of these murals were painted by the "Walldogs" during the summer of 2011. Five more were added in 2021. Each mural captures the nostalgia and historic significance of Plymouth's rich business history. Grab a mural map, get the family together and head downtown to start the fun search for these beautiful murals! Each has a sign with a QR code that can be scanned with your cell phone for information on the mural.

2. Cheese Counter and Dairy Heritage Center

Plymouth is the Cheese Capital of the World! Find out why as you engage in interactive videos, quizzes and a selfie fun center. Sample local cheeses and indulge in a specialty sandwich, panini, bowl of soup or an ice cream cone.

3. Plymouth Arts Center

520 E. Mill Street
The premier art destination in western Sheboygan County; providing diverse experiences in the Arts such as gallery exhibits, live musical and theatrical performances, art classes and more.

4. Plymouth Historical Society Museum

420 E. Mill Street
Discover Plymouth's history while visiting this 1876 cream city brick building, which houses the museum and its many changing exhibits of local interest. The Plank Road Trail exhibit offers a street scene of downtown Plymouth. Walk on an actual plank road and gaze into the storefront windows that were once present in the 1850's.

5. Historic Downtown Plymouth

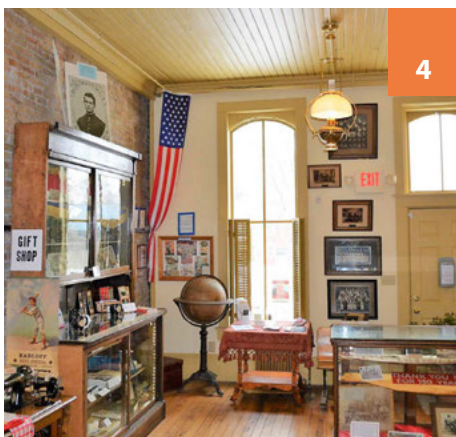

Parks



Bishop Park

788 Bishop Avenue

Located at the end of Bishop Street, this .2-acre park contains playground equipment and a picnic area.



Bade-Utility Park

11 S. Milwaukee Street

2-acre park located near the intersection of S. Milwaukee Street (Hwy 67) and E. Mill Street. It contains two lighted tennis/pickleball courts and a foot bridge that crosses the Mullet River. There is also a recreation trail that begins/ends at S. Milwaukee Street and follows the Mullet River to the east.

Carl Loebe Field

500 Parkview Drive

Carl Loebe Field functions as an active recreation facility. This 4.5-acre site includes a lighted baseball diamond, fencing, concession stand, bleachers and restrooms.



City Park

203 Suhrke Road

City Park is the community's most versatile park. This 18-acre facility is the city's largest developed park and provides a variety of active and passive recreational pursuits. City Park is home to the Aquatic Center and the 7th Element Skate Park. Other facilities include a lighted softball diamond, concession stand, restrooms, basketball court, volleyball court, outdoor aquatic center with zero-entry pool and slides, playground equipment, picnic areas, lighted winter sledding hill, large parking lot and band shell. The Lower Shelter is available for rent as are the Cake Stand and Band Shell.

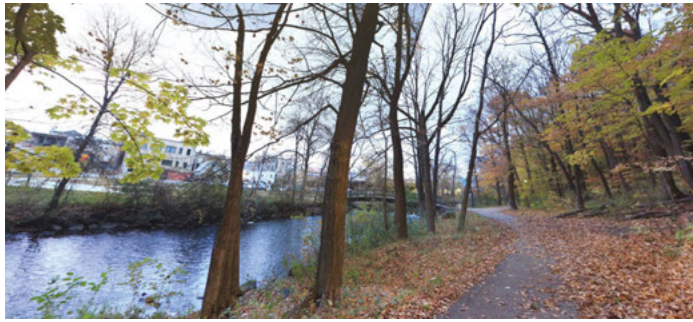
Evergreen-Kensington Park 

2107 Kensington
 Adjacent to Evergreen Golf Course, .5-acre park that contains playground equipment.



H.M. Meyer Nature Park        

300 Daleview Drive
 25-acre park located in the southwest portion of the city adjacent to the Mullet River. This park has playground equipment, a parking lot and a frisbee golf course. Meyer Park contains a paved walking path for enjoyment of the natural beauty of the area. The recreational trail runs through the park beginning at Daleview Drive and continues to S. Milwaukee Street.



Henry H. Huson Park  

400 Collins Street
 This 2.4-acre park has bench seating adjacent to the Recreation Trail which runs from the northeast to the southwest following the Mullet River. A foot bridge crosses over to the downtown area. Within the park area is a steeply wooded hillside located along the river.



Lion's Park   

1905 Valley Road
 This 6.7-acre site contains a lighted youth baseball diamond, covered bleachers, a concession stand, bathrooms, a soccer field and a parking lot.



Lone Oak Park      

2245 Valley Road
 The 8.5-acre park has a playground, a picnic shelter with restrooms, a pick-up ball diamond and off-road parking. The adjacent wooded area has a crushed limestone path.





Junior-Stayer Park     

39 S. Stafford Street

This park was completed late 2017. This ADA-inclusive playground features a dairy farm theme and is designed for kids up to 12 years of age. Also in the park is an open-air park shelter/performance pavilion. Has a walking path. Located next to the park is a fenced in dog park.



Plymouth Youth Center  

609 North Street

This facility is near Riverview Middle School on the Mullet River. Besides the outdoor basketball court, the youth center provides ample indoor space for various clubs, organizations and private citizens to hold meetings, parties and other related activities.

Pocket Park 

39 S. Stafford Street

This fun-sized park is in the parking lot of Junior-Stayer Park. It includes seating and will soon house a sculpture.



Roosevelt-Nutt Park & Nutt Ski Hill    

750 W. Main Street

Roosevelt-Nutt Park is a 10-acre site with nature trails winding through the woods with educational stops. Nutt Ski Hill is a 7-acre facility that has a beginners and main ski hill, two electric rope tows, snow making equipment and a parking lot. There is a log cabin style shelter with a kitchen, restrooms and enclosed deck including a beautiful view from the top of the hill overlooking the northwest part of the city. This shelter is available for rentals and educational opportunities.



Rotary Park      

903 E. Clifford Street

This 6.9-acre site is an active recreation facility that contains the Stan Struve Memorial Field, a lighted baseball diamond, fencing, concession stand, bleachers, restrooms, playground equipment, two volleyball courts, picnic area and parking area.

South River Park  

36 S. River Boulevard

This 2.2-acre park contains playground equipment and a softball diamond.



Veterans Park  

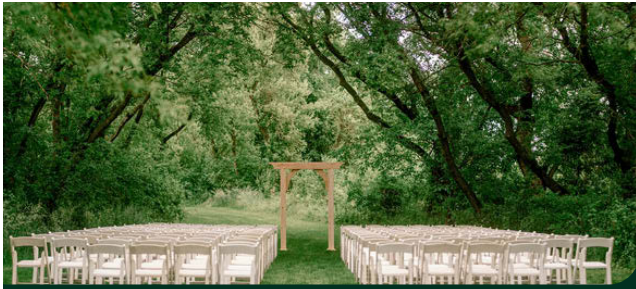
603 E. Mill Street

1/2-acre park at the intersection of E. Mill Street, North Street and Eastern Avenue. It contains benches and landscaping and provides a view of the Mullet River Dam and the river below the dam. It also is home to the September 11th, 2001 freedom tree memorial which was dedicated July 20th, 2002.

Veteran Memorial Trail 

603 E. Mill Street

The trail winds along the Mullet River starting at Eastern Avenue and ends near the Mullet River Dam. There are 12 landmarks with flags representative of the war or conflict each landmark symbolizes. There are seating areas and an entry plaza with a Memorial Bell.

Schools



The Plymouth Public School District serves over 2,000 students from the City of Plymouth and surrounding communities. They have close to 300 full-time faculty and staff members, who are dedicated to educating the young people in our community.

There are three public elementary schools (4K-grade 4), one middle school (grade 5-8) and one high school (grade 9-12). The Mayor of the City of Plymouth is Don Pohlman, who serves part-time. Mayor Pohlman works with the City Administrator to ensure that all city ordinances and state laws are observed and enforced, and that all city officers, staff, boards and commissions properly discharge their duties. The Mayor is present at all Common Council meetings and may vote in the case of a tie. The Mayor represents Plymouth at official gatherings.

The Common Council is the legislative branch of City Government. The Common Council is the forum for review and debate of proposed ordinances, resolutions and policies proposed by the standing Council Committees and boards and commissions. The most important legislation is the annual City Budget. The Common Council is comprised of eight part-time alderpersons representing four aldermanic districts. Each alderperson serves a two-year term. The Council operates on a committee structure with the following standing committees:

- Committee of the Whole (Entire Common Council)
- Finance & Personnel Committee (4 Council members and Mayor)
- Public Works & Utilities Committee (4 Council members and Mayor)

In addition to the Council committees, there are several boards and commissions that provide policy input to the Mayor and Common Council and are comprised of citizen members and alderperson representation. These bodies include the Plan Commission, Board of Park Commissioners, Redevelopment Authority and Library Board as prescribed by Wisconsin statutes. From time to time, the City may also have "ad-hoc" committees like the "Utilities Building Committee."

Common Council Meetings are held on the second and last Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm in the Council Chambers of the City Hall.

BOATING, CANOEING AND KAYAKING

HIKING

There are several miles of hiking trails within the Kettle Moraine State Forest-Northern Unit. The Ice Age National Scenic Trail travels for 31 miles through the length of the forest. Hiking is also available at the Greenbush recreation area (13.5 miles) and Parnell Tower loop (3.5 miles)

HORSEBACK RIDING

Equestrians can enjoy 41 miles of bridle trail through the Northern Kettle Moraine State Forest which are traditionally open late-April through mid-November depending on the trail conditions.

MINI GOLF & BATTING CAGES

Play 18 holes of mini golf on the family-friendly Shady Trails course or the more challenging 18 on the Stoney Creek course at Tom & Jerry's Mini Golf and Batting Cages. You can also work on your baseball or softball swing in one of six cages. Bring your own equipment or borrow theirs.

SKATE PARK

7th Element Skate Park is a small outdoor skate park, including two 4-foot quarter pipes, 2-4 foot mini roll-ins, one 3-foot spine and more.

TENNIS

The city maintains two tennis courts at Bade-Utility Park. The courts are open on a first-come, first-served basis and are lit at night.

GENERATIONS' VITA COURSE

Located on the grounds of Generations Intergenerational Center, the Generations' Vita Course offers fitness fanatics of all ages and abilities the opportunity to have more exercise choices. Plymouth's only Vita Course offers 10 exercise stations.

BIKING

The Old Plank Road Trail

The Old Plank Road Trail runs from the Kohler Erie Avenue Trailhead in the City of Sheboygan west roughly 21 miles to the county line. The terrain varies from flat to gently rolling with one large climb or descent near County Highway S just east of Greenbush. The Old Plank Road Trail was one of the first trails in the nation to share the right-of-way with a 4-lane divided highway. The first sections of the trail were built in the late 1970's with the most recent sections having been added in 2021; the trail was extended another 4.4 miles to the county line where it runs to the City of Fond du Lac. The trail is shared by a variety of users including cyclists, walkers, joggers, mopeders, equestrians and in the winter months, snowmobilers.

Kettle Moraine State Forest, Northern Unit

Single-track mountain bike trails are maintained at the Greenbush recreation area, totaling about 9 miles. A state trail pass is required for all bike riders age 16 and over on these trails. Normally, these trails are opened in late April through November, depending on trail conditions.

Rocky Knoll Mountain Bike & Hiking Trail Network

Construction began July 22, 2019 on an approximately 5 mile mountain biking and hiking trail at the 62-acre Rocky Knoll Health Center Campus. The base trail is complete, though, it is anticipated some revisions and additions will be made moving forward. WisCorps crews and Planning & Conservation Department staff completed the majority of the work.

Road America 4 Miles of Fitness

Monday and Wednesday nights from 6-8pm May-August, then in September 5:30-7:30pm. Participants have free reign over Road America's cross country trails, service roads and the 4-mile, 14 turn road racing surface itself. Bike, walk or run.

Plymouth Recreational Trail

A dedicated trail winding throughout the city; follows along city streets and city-paved routes. Connects to The Old Plank Road Trail.





WINTER

CROSS COUNTRY SKIING

Kettle Moraine State Forest, Northern Unit

The Greenbush recreation area offers more than 13 miles of machine-groomed cross-country ski trails. Pets, hiking, snowshoeing and biking are not allowed on ski trails while they are snow covered. A state trail pass is required at Greenbush and Zillmer for all skiers age 16 and over. Volunteers from the Northern Kettle Moraine Nordic Ski Club (NKMNSC), in cooperation with the state forest, regularly machine groom the ski trail system for diagonal and skate skiing.

ICE FISHING

The lakes freeze over for about three months each winter. Ice thickness and safety can vary from day to day and from location to location. Use your best judgment about the safety of the ice.

SLEDDING

Plymouth City Park's "Cardboard Hill," is a lighted winter sledding hill on the east side of the park, with a large parking lot.



Nutt Ski Hill, while currently closed for skiing until Winter 2025, is still a great option for sledding. There is also a beautiful view from the top of the hill overlooking the northwest part of the city.

ICE SKATING

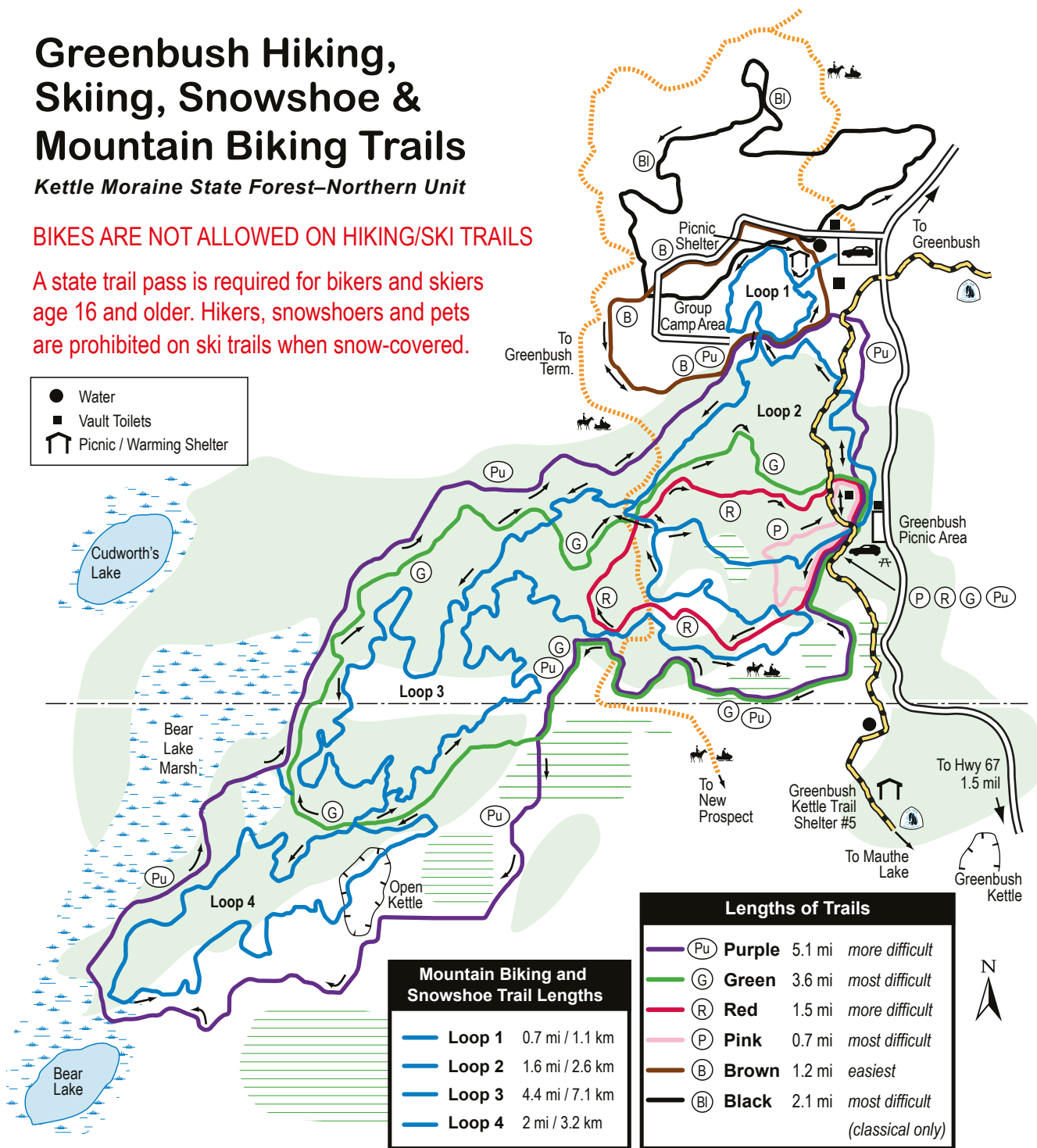

The Mullet River travels through Plymouth, Wisconsin. It is surrounded by natural beauty and also cuts through downtown. This little gem offers scenic beauty and opportunities for kayaking and fishing.

Kayaking on the Mullet River is now made easier by a new kayak launch located by Riverview Middle School. Take your kayaks or canoes there for an easy, hassle free drop into the river. This is also the widest/largest portion of the river, so you are able to explore without worrying about the Mullet's varying water levels.

Fishing is another great way to enjoy the Mullet River. The most popular species caught are smallmouth bass, northern pike and bluegill. A popular location for fishing is at the dam located by Veterans Memorial Trail, downtown Plymouth.

Take a look at some of the fish you may discover in the Mullet River.



Labeled a "panfish," the bluegill is almost as wide as it is long. Length sometimes reaches 10-12 inches and weigh up to 2 pounds.



An average smallmouth weighs between 1 and 2 pounds, will measure about 12 inches and is considered the scrappiest fish of all.



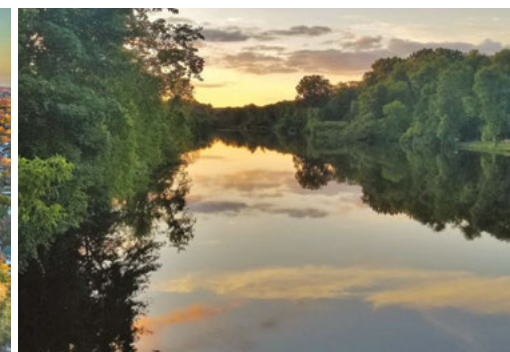
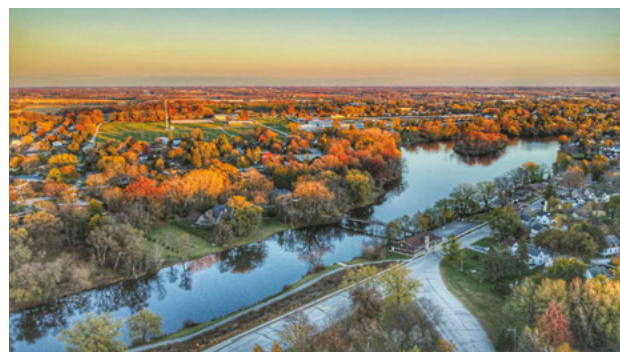
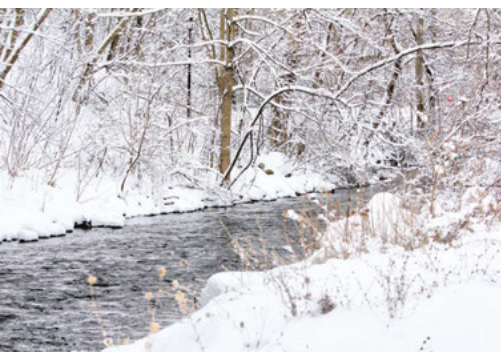
The largemouth grows to a weight up to 11 pounds and length of about 24 inches.
